2. ENTRY FEE of \$0.75 per item will be charged. *exception Garden Exhibit (Dept. J) \$3.00* Exhibitor Parking Pass for evenings of Monday – Saturday are available to exhibitors for \$5.
3. Exhibitors will be limited to TWO entries under any one-premium number. *exception Dept. O, limited to ONE entry.
4. All exhibitors MUST have Social Security number on entry blank.
5. Entries must be mailed to: Denise Sinclair, 1131 Randolph, Carlyle, Illinois 62231, or e-mail to clintoncofaireentries@gmail.com Exhibitors are requested to file their entries as early as possible as this will save office work and will be to the advantage of both the exhibitor and association. **Entries must be received by the Friday before the fair so that entry tags can be printed and ready for the articles.** Please pick up entry tags and pay entry fees in the **fair office** on Sunday, before taking entries to the Science & Arts Building. Unless prior arrangements have been made to pick tags up earlier.
6. Items will be accepted on Sunday between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
7. Limited to residents of Clinton County.
8. No articles can be entered which has been previously awarded a premium at the Clinton County Fair. The superintendent has the right to disqualify any exhibit.
9. No one in the building during judging except for judge and superintendent.
10. All articles must be finished, and have been made within the last year, except quilts and afghans.
11. Every precaution will be taken to insure the safety of exhibits but the Fair is not responsible for damage or loss of entries.
12. All articles must be picked up the last day of the fair (Saturday) between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. unless prior arrangements are made with the superintendent. Premiums will be paid by check and will be available between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on the day of the fair (Saturday) in the Science & Arts Building. **All premiums uncalled for or premium checks not cashed by August 31 shall be deemed donations to the fair.**
13. Any articles left in the building that are not claimed before July 31 will become property of the association and will be disposed of immediately.
